

APRIL 2011 SUPERVISOR REPORT

April started with the Grand Blanc Chamber of Commerce Meeting with Dave Robertson reporting on legislative matters in Lansing. Later in the day, I met with the Community Foundation in regard to a potential grant. The following Monday, I traveled to Troy to talk with Frank Irwin, Government Affairs Director for Magna Inc. to talk about the MEGA grant and the expansion plans for Magna Electric. Tuesday was the weekly attorney meeting and follow up with some of the things in the office. Wednesday, was TAC at the County where the elimination of the I-475 connection as presented by the Freight Connectivity study was discussed. Subsequently, the Metropolitan Planning Commission did drop this from the future plans at this time. Wednesday was a press conference downtown on the Greater Genesee Health Coalition.
